Reading in EYFS

Reading is an absolute priority in EYFS


Reading is an absolute priority in EYFS, providing children with a life long skill and passion that will last well beyond the school gates.

We use a phonics scheme called Read Write Inc the children start these lessons within the first two weeks of school.

Reading for pleasure is also a priority throughout the school and every day your child will bring home a book to share with you from their book corner. We have also have 3 key authors in EYFS and the children read these book over and over again with their teacher and by themselves.

Beyond EYFS

Choosing a school for your child is such an important decision, we know that you will want to find out what we can offer your child for the rest of their time at Nova.

Reading

Based on extensive research, **Success For All**, is a Literacy programme for teaching reading and speaking and listening .

The programme covers the important elements of Literacy, including reading, speaking and listening from Year 3 to Year 6. It helps to develop aspects of learning behaviour through the use of Co-operative learning strategies. Children also learn to work with others, as a team and with partners. Partner and team talk is encouraged and children make progress in lessons as a result of this. An ideal SFA lesson should mean that the children are constructively talking far more than the teachers!

Children continue to learn reading through phonics until they can decode fluently. They are then introduced to a range of high quality texts matched to their reading levels

Writing

Writing is closely linked to reading and teachers often use books as a starting point for a wide range of different pieces of writing. Children are taught handwriting daily and have weekly spelling assessments.

Maths

Like many other schools in the country, we follow the **White Rose Maths** curriculum which presents opportunities for children to engage in maths in concrete, pictorial and abstract ways. Children have weekly arithmetic skills tests and use **TT Rockstars** to develop their times tables fluency.

Ambitions Curriculum

In September 2022, we launched our Ambitions Curriculum. We have redesigned our curriculum to promote key skills and knowledge. Children are encouraged to think and learn like historians, geographers, artists and designers. Each year group plans an exciting termly overview which is shared with parents. Friday newsletters let parents know what learning will be taking place the next week so you can share in your child's learning journey. Parents are invited in to termly year group assemblies to celebrate the learning and work the children have been doing in class.

What is a hub?

There are many hubs in different schools across Peterborough. In our school we have the Peterborough Primary Hub for pupils with Hearing Impairment.

Our hub has two roles:

- To support other schools
- To support a small number of pupils who may find that they need communication support, due to a hearing impairment, to access the learning opportunities in a mainstream school.


What do we do at Nova Primary Academy?

- We work with specialist services, to provide pupils with appropriate and individualised support, so that all pupils feel they belong and are fully involved in school life.
- Hub staff support the pupils to access all areas of learning and many extracurricular activities
- We are a deaf aware school and the hub staff have a supportive role in maintaining deaf awareness with the school environment and provision
- Hub staff work with the Teachers of the Deaf to develop up to date knowledge and expertise in HI equipment and can support children and staff with equipment issues.
- Hub staff have BSL qualifications and knowledge to support language development and communication across the school

We are so proud of our specialist Deaf Hub. Ofsted Inspectors reported that, 'The provision for deaf pupils and those with hearing impairment is well developed. These pupils learn how to be successful in school and the wider world.'

Breakfast for all

Since January 2022, we have provided a breakfast bagel for all pupils when they arrive at school as we recognise that no child can engage in their learning if they are hungry.

Our school mascots

Marvin and Minnie are our school mascots. They look after children who are having a difficult day and go with the children on all their school trips and visits.



Clubs and activities

We offer an extensive range of activities to all pupils in the school including girls and boys football, Lego, coding, country dancing, sign language and yoga! Children performed at the Cresset Theatre in dance and singing.

We are proud of our sporting achievements, reaching the national finals of NFL Flag and regional finals in both girls and boys football in 2022. Children compete against other local schools and also take part in Trust competitions.

Wrap around care

With support from Cross Keys Housing, we are able to offer wrap around care at a greatly reduced price (50% reduced fee) to support our parents. This out of hours child care is offered through Simply Out of School and takes place in the community centre next to the school.
