Autumn

#### Standing Ovation

We will listen to classical music that represents fireworks like Handel's Music for the Royal Fireworks. We will talk about different parts of the music and match firework movements to the song.

## Castles, Knights and Dragons

We will learn to sing and perform different well-known nursery rhymes. We will practise singing in a group and on our own learning to follow a melody.

# Your Imagination


We will be learning to sing a variety of songs linked to the theme 'Imagination'. We will practise finding the pulse and clapping rhythms before learning to perform a song as a group. We will practise keeping in time with others as we sing.


Rhythm in the Way We Walk and Banana Rap

We will be developing our vocal skills whilst learning two songs.

We will learn about rhythm, pitch and pulse and how to listen to and appraise music.. We will learn how to rap over a backing track. We will also learn about the names of different instruments whilst listening for them in music.

### Ukuleles

We will build on our Year 5 learning by practising previously learned chords and being introduced to the C and Am chords. We will practise strumming and reading music notation with crotchets and quavers. We will combine all of our learning to sing and play along to a song as a group.

# Glockenspiels and Composition

We will listen to and appraise different songs from the jazz genre. We will revise all of our previous learning on playing the glockenspiel and apply it to playing a jazz song and improvising our own parts using the notes we have learnt to compose a section of music.

#### You've Got a Friend

We will listen to, appraise and compare songs from the ballad and pop genre whilst revising our previous learning on beat, rhythm, pitch and tempo. We will learn to sing and harmonise You've Got a Friend by Carole King before adding ukuleles to enhance our performance.

At KS3, pupils will also expand their learning on the following:

-improvising, composing and performing using voice and instruments.

-using staff and other relevant notations appropriately and accurately in a range of styles and genres.

-learn more about tone, scales and other musical devices taught within the primary curriculum

-listen with increasing understanding to a wide range of music from great composers and musicians.

-develop a deepening understanding of the music they perform, and listen to, and its history.

At KS3 pupils will learn more about the following:

-performing, listening to, reviewing and evaluating music across a range of historical periods, genres, styles and traditions.

-learning to sing and use their voices to create and compose music on their own and with others.

 understanding and exploring how music is created, produced and communicated through pitch, duration, dynamics, tempo, timbre, texture and structure.
